#### **How to Book**

In the first instance, we are asking for you to submit consent via MCAS and submit your child's trip preference list. Please submit your preference by **26 May 2023**. The preference list can be accessed via the link and QR code below.

	subject to full payment by 9 July. Confirmation will be by text and discounts will be
	allocated
Friday 16 June	You will receive <b>confirmation of a provisional place</b> on the trip by this date. You
	will also get the confirmation via text and discount applied. The place will be
	confirmed when <b>full payment</b> is received.
Friday 7 July	<u>Full payment</u> is required by 9 am. If consent and payment is not received by this
	date, your child will be unable to attend the proposed visit.

## **Automatic Eligibility**

We hope that as many students as possible will get involved in Airedale on Tour. We have sent information regarding eligibility. Automatic eligibility for Airedale on Tour is as follows:

• Excellent or improving attendance

- Excellent or improving behaviour
- High or improving PRIDE score

## Students who are not Automatically Eligible

We are delighted that the vast majority of our students meet the criteria for automatic eligibility. We have already sent out notification of eligibility. We will communicate to you separately through MCAS and text if your child is **NOT** automatically eligible for Airedale on Tour. Students who do not meet these criteria may still be eligible; they will be referred to a staff panel that will look at each individual case and you will be informed of the outcome. Students who are not currently eligible may still book a place but will not receive priority allocation. All money paid will be refunded if your child is ineligible.

#### **Discounts**

Over 200,000 PRIDE points have been awarded to our students. This is amazing and represents two hundred thousand opportunities to reward our pupils for getting it right. Students with the highest scores will have first choice of visits. All students will receive discounts proportionate to their number of points. Discounts are also awarded for attendance and overall PRIDE scores and will be communicated to you later in the term. Any overpayments in excess of the cost of the trip and the discount will be refunded to you.

### **Behaviour Expectations**

High standards of behaviour are paramount to the safety and enjoyment of all and as ever, we reserve the right to remove any students who do not show that they are able to meet our expectations. Final eligibility for trips rests with our staff.

## **Dress Code**

Whilst we do not expect students to wear school uniform on this day, there will be a specific dress code for each trip and this will be communicated to you once the trip is confirmed. Students should not wear revealing clothing such as cropped tops, and shorts/skirts must be of a reasonable length. Usual jewellery rules apply. This dress code must be adhered to.

## Medical and medication

Please ensure we have up-to-date medical information for your child. Students are required to have all relevant medications with them on the visit, including inhalers. If they fail to bring them, they may not be permitted to attend. Some journeys are long. If your child needs travel sickness medication, please ensure they take it prior to leaving home. If you wish to provide it for the return journey, this must be clearly labelled and given to the member of staff with a note to say you give permission for this to be administered. As it will be the height of summer, please remember to administer any anti-histamine for hayfever.

## **Cancellation policy**

In line with the school policy, students who do not attend will not receive a refund unless a replacement can be found for the visit.

## Consent

By enrolling your child on MCAS, you give your consent for your child to take part in the visit and understand the cancellation policy applies. You certify that all contact details and medical information is accurate and you understand that it is your responsibility to inform the visit leader should any of this information changes. You also understand that if you fail to disclose any medical issues then you will be held responsible for any costs incurred as a result of these issues, as the insurance provided by the Academy may be invalidated.

In the event of an emergency, we use the contact details from Bromcom to contact you. Please ensure that if you have made any changes to your contact number that they have been updated through your MCAS account.

By providing consent on MCAS, you agree for your child to be transported in a minibus, should it be required for your child's chosen visit.

We are now using Trip Aid; a mobile app for the purposes of geo-location monitoring of students and secure communication services. The academy uses this app to locate, track and monitor your child during the school trip and activities that take place off site and for the academy and its teachers to use the App to communicate with your child during the active period of the school trip and its activities taking place off the academy's premises for the relevant intended purposes of location monitoring, planning and itinerary management. We will need parental consent for this.

At the end of the trip, your child will be responsible for making their own way home from the academy. If your child needs collecting from the academy, please contact the office on **info@airedaleacademy.com** quoting 'AoT – End of Trip Arrangements'.
