Dear Parents/Carers

I hope this letter finds you well and that your child/children have enjoyed their first half term at school. Although I'm sure they (and you) are ready for the half term break.

Headteachers from across the Trust inform me that pupils have made a good start to the new school year and on my recent visits to the schools, I can certainly see that this is the case. It is now vital that we keep up this momentum and ensure a high-quality education for all.

Trust Wide Standards and Expectations

It is important for our Trust that we promote and remind parents, carers and pupils of the exceptionally high standards we have at Northern Ambition Academies Trust. We will achieve these high standards through a relentless focus, from each and every one of us, on insisting on exceptionally high expectations both in and out of the classroom. We make no excuses and expect the same commitment to these standards from all Trust staff. A clear message has been given to our staff and to our pupils, that both are responsible for keeping standards and expectations high in our schools. It is a mutual responsibility and key to the success of every single young person educated within our Trust. Parents and carers can support with this by continuing to send your child to school every day, equip them so they are ready to learn and encourage them to do their very best.

We make no apologies for insisting on positive and respectful behaviour from each and every child both in school and out in the community. All staff want nothing more than to see the children succeed and enjoy their time at school. However, on occasion, sanctioning a child for poor behaviour is required and in order to allow other children to enjoy their education in a positive learning environment, we make this clear to families and pupils as they begin their education with us.

Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) within the Community

I am very aware that the behaviour of some young people within the local community is causing concern amongst parents, carers and residents. Whilst not all these young people attend a Northern Ambition school, many do. I can assure you that all pupils who attend our schools are educated around not only the risks associated with taking part in ASB, but the impact that ASB has on the community in which they live. It disappoints me hugely that some children choose to ignore this advice and guidance whilst not in our care. All pupils have been told very clearly that they will be sanctioned if they take part in any form of ASB within the local community whilst wearing a Northern Ambition school Uniform. As always, your support and reinforcement of this message to your child/children is greatly appreciated. In the meantime, I will continue to work closely with local youth groups and the Police to further support the concerning increase in ASB incidents.

Attendance

Attendance to school remains a national and local concern. At Northern Ambition Academies Trust, we recognise that improving attendance to school is everyone's business, but we continue to experience levels of pupil absence which is far too high. We are already seeing too many pupils missing school since the beginning of the autumn term, many without reason.

Although we strive to successfully treat the root cause of absence and ensure that we do all we can to remove barriers to attendance, we cannot do that without your support. It is essential that we work

together. Our attendance policy clearly outlines how we aim to work with you to improve attendance levels. If you have difficulties in accessing this policy on our websites, please let your school know. Pupils in all of our schools are being reminded of the benefits of good attendance at every opportunity and our schools will continue to celebrate and reward those who attend every day or have improved attendance.

Staff across our Trust know exactly what is needed to ensure pupils make up for lost time and all schools have comprehensive plans in place to do so, but they cannot support pupils with this if they are absent. I therefore ask that you ensure your child/children are in school every day in order to make the most of the education on offer. If you are experiencing problems which are impacting on your child's attendance to school, please contact the school and we will work with you to resolve this.

Uniform

Each school has a clear, consistent policy around school uniform. We aim to instil high standards in our very youngest children in order to prepare them, the best we can, for their journey through education and ultimately, within the world of work. Your child's school will have a very clear uniform policy and we would ask that you remind yourself of this to ensure that your child has the correct uniform every day, including a school bag and equipment.

Our Values


