This term has seen the focus move from University applications to apprenticeships and job applications. Students are working hard to develop their CV's and beginning to look ahead to which career paths they will choose. On February 23rd we were fortunate to have a visit from Adrian Bird from Apprenticeship Finder who has offered to work with some of our students to help them find the right apprenticeships for them.



At the same time the Health and Social Care students have been working closely with Connecting Care to make sure that they gain a realistic experience of work in that sector and took part in some filming as part of the project which will be used locally on Wakefield CCG and Connecting Care's social media accounts. Watch out for future work being done with this group next year involving the students that will be joining the Sixth Form from the current Year 11.

Our Year 13 Business Studies students completed a two week work placement on Monday the 12th March which helped them to experience the work place and complete one of their important course units. The feedback from the work placements about our young people was fantastic, they were a credit to the school.

## STUDENTS EXPERIENCE ACTION PACKED **ICELAND ADVENTURE!**



On Sunday 11 February 43 students and 7 members of staff set off on an adventure of a lifetime to Iceland. However, we were told when we reached the airport that Keflavik airport was closed, because of high winds and we didn't fly until 3am the next day! Despite the setback, spirits were high; the group had a fantastic time over the four days. The itinerary was jam-packed to make up for the delay. The highlights of the first full day included: trekking through the Þingvellir National Park, witnessing the eruption of the Great Geysir and seeing the bubbling water of the hot springs. At Gullfoss, we saw the cascading waterfalls, looked around

a geothermal power station and ate square burgers at the Hamburger Factory. To finish the first day, we visited the Laugardalslaug swimming pool. On the way back to the hotel, students in Y11 helped a stranded couple in their car, giving them a much-needed push to

get going again – well done team, you were immense!

The second full day started at a very early 6am and went on until 1am the next morning! Students were treated to a swim in the mineral-rich waters of the Blue Lagoon, walked next to the 200 ft Skogafoss waterfall, visited the awesome Black Beach and then finished the South Shore day by visiting the Seljalandsfoss waterfall, which was packed with so much snow that students could not walk behind it as originally planned! In the evening, students visited the Hresso restaurant in downtown Reykjavik. The very final activity of a long and arduous trip was to see the Northern Lights, which



was just magical – a lime-green dancing curtain appeared as the clouds cleared and thousands of stars could be seen above our heads.



We had to get back up at 3am to get ready for a 4am departure most Y11s stayed up the entire night and some students had only had 6 hours of sleep over the 4 days! After speaking to most of the students Monday morning, it's clear they made up for it when they returned to the UK! ### Students prepare for Three Peaks challenge to raise money for Cancer Research

A dedicated group of Y11 students, Mr Miller and Miss Kershaw are planning to complete the Yorkshire Three Peaks Challenge, while raising money to donate to Cancer Research. Everyone in the group is undertaking the challenge in memory of loved ones who have been affected by cancer.

The challenge is to walk the Three Peaks of Pen-y-ghent, Whernside and Ingleborough, which is a 24-mile trek. The walk is going to take place on Saturday 28 April 2018. The students are aiming to complete all three peaks - ideally in under 12 hours. As preparation for the challenge, the group went to Pendle Hill on 17 March to do hill training with a trained guide. It's going to be gruelling and tough, but nowhere near as tough as losing a loved one.

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### **6TH FORM PERFORMING ARTS - THE CAST**

What a hectic and rewarding 3 months! Theatre has to be in your blood to work at the pace and depth our students do. The 6th form Performing Arts continues to go from strength to strength.

After 3 very successful performances of 'A Chorus Line' with 3 different casts in December 2017, we move to January the 7th, when 28 of our 6th form performing arts students escorted by Mrs. Bell, Mrs Nickerson and Mr Leake flew off to New York for 6 days. With heavy snow in the USA, worries were that we would be unable to land at JFK airport, it was touch and go for a while. We did manage to land, only to be evacuated from the airport due to a flood - without our luggage! However, even without our luggage for the whole 6 days, we had an amazing and inspirational time. We visited the Empire State at night with the wonderful views over New York. We spent an emotional day at Ellis Island and the Statue of Liberty followed by a serene visit to the Ground Zero memorial. We had the best seats in the house to see the musical 'Miss Saigon' as a group and individually saw Broadway shows such as Hello Dolly with Bette Midler, Anastasia, Chicago, School of Rock and Phantom of the Opera. We had masterclass workshops with cast members and the musical director of both Miss Saigon and Hairspray. The 3 time Tony Award winner of Hairspray was so impressed with our Cast that she came to visit us in the hotel and brought everyone a gift - unforgettable

Since our return we have worked tirelessly to raise money for our final major production unit of 'Ghost - The Musical', which required a hire charge of £5,000 for a video wall to perform the illusions of Sam walking through walls amongst other tricks. These amazing students raised £2,200 in a fundraising evening at the Townville Club; £1,500 by walking the Tri Peaks with the help of Mr Miller and Miss Kershaw; 'Saturday Night Live with The Cast', a Kabaret evening at our own Phoenix Theatre which raised £1,622 and the competition 'Sing!' raised £220. They have also been lucky enough to have had working visits from the Assistant Director and illusionist from the national tour of Ghost and a personal email from the playwright, directly helping them understand the back story of the show.

The Cast have also performed a flash mob of 'One Day More' from the musical Les Miserables at the Keep Moat stadium, Doncaster on behalf of Castleford Alcohol Partnership promotion and education work.

On top of all this, our students have all been auditioning for Universities and Theatre Schools and 100% have been successful, many with large scholarships. We have our talented students performing in regional theatre in both lead and ensemble roles in 42nd Street, Sister Act, Cats, Les Miserables to name a few.
